The City has nearly 900 residential units in active construction with nearly 8,000 more in the pipeline. Over 25 residential communities are under construction and 4 more are in plan check.



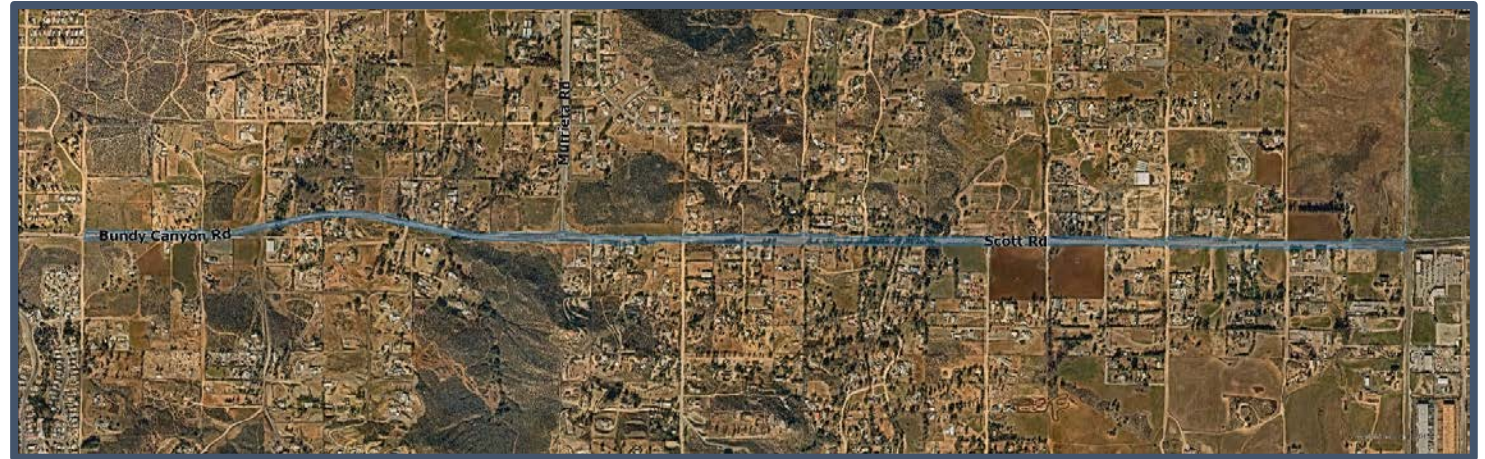
