Dear Secretary Austin and General Milley:

With the Omnibus Appropriations Act for Fiscal Year 2022 now law, I am writing to ensure that the expectation of immediate support to Ukraine is fulfilled. With the strong support of Congress, the Administration has utilized drawdown authority for Ukraine five times in just the last six months. Combined with \$200 million authorized on March 12, 2022, the total value of equipment for Ukraine reached \$1 billion in the last week alone. Under the Ukraine Supplemental Appropriations Act, another \$1.7 billion in drawdown authority remains available to be expended from Department inventories in order to support their sovereignty and territorial integrity.

I expect some of these funds to provide Stinger short-range air defense missiles and launch units, Javelin portable anti-tank missile systems, and Switchblade 600 anti-armor miniature loitering munitions to Ukrainian forces. The committee notes the apparent absence of a Department of Defense plan to meet munition replenishment requirements for our U.S. stocks of these critical systems and those of other contributing allies and partners. As we have heard from neighboring Baltic neighbors, this is a matter of the highest urgency.

Therefore, I strongly urge the Department of Defense to develop a plan to meet immediate munition replenishment requirements, prioritize the acceleration of industrial base capacity for these munitions and other urgent needs, and to develop a long-term plan for low-cost, exportable solutions that modernize or replace current systems and increase resistance capabilities for Ukraine and its neighbors. This includes accelerated procurement of the next generation Javelin command launch units for U.S. and partner forces as well as missile procurements at rates that meet COCOM requirements. Finally, I respectfully request to be consulted early and often as to any possible reprogramming requests as this conflict continues.
