Transitional housing plays a crucial role in preventing these residents from returning to the streets.
- Central Avenue Interchange: Linking Lake Elsinore to Riverside County The City, in collaboration with Caltrans, is proposing enhancements to the Interstate (I-15)/State Route 74 (SR-74) (Central Avenue) interchange in Lake Elsinore to alleviate traffic congestion, improve traffic flow, and support regional growth and development initiatives. The I-15/SR-74 Interchange Improvement Project aims to enhance directional connectivity, increase ramp storage, optimize signalized intersections, and enhance mobility and access for all users, residents, and businesses in the project area.

We are writing to express our support for the City of Lake Elsinore's requests for community project funding in the fiscal year 2025. The following three projects hold immense potential to significantly enhance the well-being of our community and its residents. Importantly, these initiatives are perfectly aligned with the City's ambitious long-term strategic framework, the Dream Extreme 2040 Plan. This plan serves as a roadmap towards our shared vision of transforming Lake Elsinore into the ultimate lake destination, where individuals of all backgrounds can not only reside, but also work, indulge in recreational activities, and pursue their dreams, thus laying the foundation for vibrant futures.

Lake Water Quality Project: A Renewed and Restored Lake Elsinore

As Southern California's largest freshwater lake, Lake Elsinore is a vital resource for both wildlife and recreation. Lake Elsinore has suffered from numerous algae blooms, fish kills, and closures due to poor water quality and high bacteria levels. The most recent and longest lake shutdown occurred over a sixmonth period starting in August of 2022. Lake Elsinore serves as a pivotal catalyst for economic growth within the City of Lake Elsinore. Its strategic location and diverse range of opportunities contribute significantly to the city's economic prosperity.

In August 2023, the Lake Elsinore City Council approved a comprehensive lake management plan aimed at improving water quality for future generations.

This initiative is crucial for the restoration of Lake Elsinore. To support this effort, the City is requesting \$8 million in federal funding to construct the necessary infrastructure for oxygen delivery to the entire lake.

Federal Funding Sought: \$8 million City Contribution: \$4.5 million

Homeless Services: Phase Two

In the last year, our homeless street outreach team exited 175 homeless residents. Our Anchor facility, a crisis stabilization center continues to bring homeless individuals off the street and into a supportive environment where they are evaluated and matched with healthcare services, mental health support, and permanent housing.

To ensure the sustainability of housing initiatives, the City is requesting \$2.5 million in federal funding to support the development of Phase Two.

Federal Funding Sought: \$2.5 million

City Contribution: \$500,000

Central Avenue Interchange: Linking Lake Elsinore to Riverside County

The City in cooperation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), is proposing improvements to the Interstate (I-15)/State Route 74 (SR-74) (Central Avenue) interchange located in Lake Elsinore. The I-15/SR-74 Interchange Improvement Project is needed to improve traffic conditions, reduce congestion at the interchange, and help alleviate traffic surrounding local intersections within the project area. Total construction costs for this project are estimated at \$45 million. Federal appropriations will fund right-of-way acquisition, construction, and construction support services.

The project is geared towards achieving multiple objectives essential for the development and efficiency of the region. These goals include supporting anticipated regional growth and development projects, alleviating congestion through enhancements in ramp storage and directional connectivity between I-15 and SR-74, improving the operational efficiency of signalized intersections, and fostering better mobility and access for all users within the project limits, including residents and businesses.

Federal Funding Sought: \$2.5 million

City Contribution: \$500,000

We are fully committed to championing every one of these projects, recognizing their significant potential for the betterment of our community. With great anticipation, we seek your invaluable support to bolster the continued expansion and progress within the vibrant landscape of the City of Lake Elsinore.
